This will mean by the time we get to 2030, we must be removing 79 megatonnes of greenhouse gases from the national economy in 2030.

# FOREST INDUSTRIES: The Climate's Best Friend

Australia's forest plantations and managed native forests are a renewable and sustainable resource, consisting of some 2 million hectares of hardwood and softwood plantations plus around 5.5 million hectares of sustainably managed native forest of which about half a percent is harvested and regenerated each year.



The 4th assessment report of the International Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) says:

"A sustainable forest management strategy aimed at maintaining or increasing forest carbon stocks, while producing an annual sustained yield of timber, fibre or energy from the forest, will generate the largest sustained (carbon) mitigation benefit."
